Residents come as miserable souls that have burned all bridges and have lost all hope. These miserable souls need a Mighty Savior. The SAFE House Substance Abuse

Ministry points them to a Power greater than themselves.

Mark's Gospel gives the account of Legion, who was a menace to society. "No man could restrain him" (Mark 5:3). Jesus told the demonic spirit to "Come out of him" (Mark 5:8). Amid the many communities that make up the Gulf of Mexico, Pass Christian, (chris-tee-ann), Mississippi was one of the most devastated. For the past two years Canaan's Men's SAFE house has joined forces with Grace Church of Mahomet and others in embarking on concerted efforts to aid and assist the residents of Pass Christian.

A coastal community that once encompassed approximately 5000 residents, now Pass Christian survives off of only around 500. This survival has been made possible by GOD putting on the hearts of HIS people to leave their comfort zones in order to help others as they go through their trials and tribulations.

If you look deep, you will see the correlation

between the men of the SAFE House and those who were victims of Katrina:

- For the men of the Safe house, there were a series of issues/traumatic events and situations that caused them to pursue their addictions. This course of action led to devastation and in some cases, destruction. By these men obtaining residence in a SAFE House environment where they're assisted by the Pastor, Staff, church members and their own personal relationship with the Holy Spirit, their lives undergo restoration.
- While in Pass Christian although the devastation wasn't self-imposed, there still remained a need for other outside resources (with GOD

being the main Source) to come in to help restore not only their community but also their lives. You see, as the physical work is being done to rebuild their community, GOD provided opportunities for us from the SAFE House to share HIS love.

Along with our group, there have been groups from as far away as Canada, both coasts and all parts between. With the influx of patrons coming to serve and not be served, everyone involved is following the Word of God as it says, "Let nothing be done through selfish ambition or conceit, but in lowliness of mind let each esteem others better than himself. Let each of you look not only for his own interest, but for the interest of others." (Philippians 2:3)


